#### About the Festival

The NWSC festival strives to provide students the opportunity to pursue excellence in music performance, listen to music with understanding, and celebrate the artistic achievements of other student-musicians. Also, the festival includes the organization and performance of All-Conference ensembles including orchestra, band, and choir. The very existence of the music festival reflects the commitment of the Northwest Suburban Conference member schools to promote student opportunities in the Fine Arts as well as Athletics.

During the festival, each school's most accomplished band, orchestra, and choir present a concert for other student-musicians. This concert is also reviewed and critiqued by the guest conductor-clinician. Critical listening forms are distributed to each student-musician. They are expected to hear as many of the other bands, choirs, and orchestras as time allows. The student-musicians then write their own critiques of the various performances and turn them in to their own director. This sharing of performances in a non-competitive, collegial

atmosphere ensures the best educational experience for all student-musicians involved in the festival.

The All-Conference ensembles are select ensembles organized in October by the music educators of the NWSC. The three All-Conference ensembles rehearse two times during the month of January. These rehearsals, supported by private practice and instruction, prepare the ensembles for their dress rehearsal with the guest conductors.

Guest conductors and All-Conference ensembles work together on the first Sunday in February. After a Sunday afternoon of exciting and intense rehearsal with guest conductors and a final rehearsal on Monday afternoon, NWSC All-Conference ensembles present the Grand Finale Concert on Monday evening. The NWSC Music Festival has always featured excellent musicians and music educators as guest conductors and clinicians. Because of the support of the conference schools, these nationally recognized educators provide expert direction, commentary, and encouragement to NWSC student-musicians and directors.

## **Guest Conductors**

### **Foster Beyers**

Foster Beyers is the Director of Orchestras at Concordia College in Moorhead, MN. In addition to leading the Concordia Orchestra, he teaches instrumental conducting and special topics in music history. Prior to Concordia he served as interim director of orchestra at the College of St. Benedict and St. John's University in 2010-11. From 2008-11, he was a James Sample fellow in conducting at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities where he conducted the campus orchestra and string orchestra. He also conducted the University of Minnesota Opera Theater and Orchestra in November 2009 in 4 staged performances of Stravinsky's Opera Le Rossignol. He also conducted the Symphony Orchestra in March of 2011 in a performance of Sibelius' 7th Symphony. He was fortunate to work closely with Minnesota Orchestra Music Director Osmo Vanska in preparation for this performance.

Beyers came to Minnesota from Chicago where he served as music director of the Ravenswood Community Orchestra, assistant director of choirs at Kenilworth Union



Church, and adjunct instructor of music at Loyola University. He was a member of Victor Yampolsky's conducting studio at Northwestern University where he received a master's degree in orchestral conducting. Previously, Beyers served as music director of the Green Bay (Wis.) Symphony Youth Orchestras and taught orchestra and band in the Green Bay public schools for five years. Beyers has led orchestras including the Green Bay Symphony, St. Louis Youth Symphony, Northshore Chamber Orchestra, Skokie Valley Symphony, the Eau Claire Chamber Orchestra and the Jugendorchester Stuttgart as well as the Buffalo Community Orchestra in Minnesota. Beyers lives in Moorhead with his wife, conductor Christina Chen-Beyers and their daughter Amelia.

## **Guest Conductors**

### **Ann Howard Jones**

Ann Howard Jones is Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Boston University. She conducts the Symphonic and Chamber Choruses, supervises conducting students in the Concert Chorus and the Women's Chorale, teaches graduate choral conducting, and administers the MM and DMA programs in Choral Conducting. Dr. Jones is also the conductor of the BU Tanglewood Institute Young Artists' Vocal Program Chorus, an auditioned ensemble of high school singers which rehearses and performs at Tanglewood in the summer.

Recognized as a distinguished clinician, adjudicator, teacher and conductor, she has led many all state and regional choruses, workshops and master classes in the U.S., Europe, South America, Canada and Asia. She has been invited to teach and conduct at North Texas, Michigan State, Missouri, University of Miami, San Diego State, University of Missouri-Kansas City, Southern Methodist University, and Westminster Choir College of Rider University, University of Kentucky, and the University of New Mexico.



From 1984-1998, Dr. Jones was the assistant conductor to the late Robert Shaw and the Atlanta Symphony choruses, where she was Assistant Conductor for Choruses, sang in the alto section, assisted with the Robert Shaw Chamber Singers and helped to organize the Robert Shaw Institute. She sang and recorded with the Festival Singers both in France and in the U.S. The Festival Singers were also represented in performances of major works for chorus and orchestra at Carnegie Hall in a series of performance workshops. After Shaw's death in 1999, Dr. Jones was invited to conduct the Robert Shaw Tribute Singers for the American Choral Directors Association conferences in San Antonio and Orlando.

Choruses at Boston University have been invited to appear at conventions of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) in Boston and New York City. Dr. Jones has traveled with a group of BU graduate students to Padua and Venice, Italy, to perform and to study. A similar trip was made to Oslo and Bergen, Norway. In the spring of 2009, the graduate conducting students joined Dr. Jones at the national convention of ACDA in Oklahoma City where she was invited to prepare and conduct a world premiere of a work by Dominick Argento. The conductors sang in the chorus and assisted in the preparations for the performance.

Among the honors which Dr. Jones has received are the coveted Metcalf Award for Excellence in Teaching from Boston University, a Fulbright professorship to Brazil, and a lectureship for the Lily Foundation. At the National Conference of the American Choral Directors Association on March 9, 2011, Dr. Jones was named the recipient of the Robert Shaw Choral Award for distinguished service to the profession, the highest award given by the association.

Dr. Jones is a native of Iowa and her degrees are from the University of Iowa.



## Douglas C. Orzolek

Douglas C. Orzolek, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor of Music Education, the Associate Director of Bands, and Assistant Chair of the Music Department at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. At St. Thomas, Dr. Orzolek teaches music education methods, conducts the Symphonic Band, and teaches musical acoustics, music literature and conducting. He also teaches core classes and advises theses in the UST graduate program.

In Minnesota, Dr. Orzolek is Past-President of the Minnesota Music Educators Association and has served on the Board of Directors of the Minnesota Band Directors Association. He also served as the co-chair of MN Arts Standards Revision Committee as a result of an appointment from the Commissioner of Education. Nationally, he serves on the board of the Society for Music Teacher Educators, on the editorial board of Visions of Research in Music Education and several other music education related committees. Dr. Orzolek received the 2001 Mansfield University Young Alumni Award and was named to the Mansfield University Music Alumni Honor Roll. In 2003, the students of St. Thomas named him the Distinguished Educator of the Year. Dr. Orzolek earned the Bachelor of Music in Music Education degree from Mansfield

University of Pennsylvania, the Master of Education in Music Education from Penn State University and the Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education from the University of Minnesota.
